AMENDED - LOCAL RULE FOR SOUTHERN ENGLAND FEISEANNA

The initial closing date to be no more than 2 weeks prior to the feis. Any variation to this will be agreed by the council. i.e recognized holidays etc. For the 2 week period following the initial closing date late entries will be accepted but are subject to a £4 admin fee per dancer. Entries after this period will be accepted but will be subject to a £8 admin fee for one dancer and £10 admin fee for 2 or more dancers.

Dear Teachers.

Firstly, we would like to thank you all for supporting our 2017 Feis. We are pleased to announce that we will be returning to the same venue as last year, Ashcroft High School, Luton. It has excellent facilities and is only a five minute drive from Junction 10 of the M1 and only 3 minutes from Luton Airport. Please note the closing date for entries is Friday 13th April 2018. We would really appreciate if the closing date can be adhered to, so as to enable us to produce and publish a realistic timetable. We will only be able to do this if the entries are received on time.

Novice (bun Ghrad), Primary (tus Ghrad) and Intermediate (mean Ghrad) are open to dancers from **ALL** regions worldwide.

We have 7 experienced adjudicators and 3 world class Musicians.

There will be sashes/belts for top 5 in Premier trophies, Prelim Championships and Open Championships. The winner of the trophy reel in each grade in each age group will receive a sash in addition to the 1st place trophy. All dancers in the grades will be placed in the reel, then 50% in all other dances.

A computer service will be in operation and printed results will be available after the presentation of Championship awards.

Chris Skehill will be attending the feis where you can buy shoes, socks, CDs etc. Melaine Murphy will also be in attendance, selling wigs, tiaras and other accessories. John and Noreen Egan from Feispix will be taking photos of Championship presentations as well as studio photos. Vicky Anderson will have some of her dresses on display and will be taking orders during the weekend.

There will be hot and cold refreshments available in our canteen all weekend.

FEIS RULES

- 1. Lodgement of entries implies that you acknowledge and accept all of the Rules of An Coimisiun Le Rinci Gaelacha and the Southern England Regional Council plus the additional rules listed below, relating to the Feis.
- 2. Entries will only be accepted from Schools registered with An Coimisiun Le Rinci Gaelacha. Entries with no fee will not be processed or acknowledged.
- 3. New entries may be taken on the day of the Feis in line with SERC late entry rule. Ages to be taken from 1st January 2018.
- 5. All competitors may be required to produce their birth certificate / passport as proof of age.
- 6. All decisions of the Adjudicators are FINAL.
- 7. Committee members only may approach the Adjudicators.
- 8. ALL Grade Competitions are OPEN to all Regions.
- 9. Competitors may only dance each dance in one grade
- 10. Where there are five or less competitors in a competition, results will not affect their grading.
- 11. In all Heavy dances the lead around must be danced on both the right and left foot.
- 12.A Novice is a dancer who has not gained a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in a Novice Grade competition or any medal in a higher grade for that particular dance.
- 13. The basic step rule will apply to all Novice competitions as per the Southern England Regional Council.
- 14. The Primary Grade is for dancers who have not won a 1st or 2nd place for that particular dance in any Age Group.
- 15.All Novice and Primary dancers may only wear a class costume, simple dancewear or appropriate attire (skirt & top or simple dress for girls and trousers, shorts and t-shirt or shirt for boys) in competitions up to and including the Under 12 Age Group. Make-up will not be permitted for any dancer in the first two grades up to and including the Under 12 age group Worldwide. Failure to comply with this rule may lead to disqualification from the competition.
- 16. The Intermediate Grade is for dancers who have not won a 1st place for that particular dance in a particular Age Group, or who has not won a Premier competition, Preliminary Championships or Open Championship.
- 17. Intermediate competitors can dance their grade dances and either the Preliminary or Open Championship.
- 18 Effective from 5th February 2018
- 19 To compete in a Preliminary Championship dancers must not:
 - Have placed in the Top 3 of an OPEN Championship in the previous twelve months
 - Have won more than 2 Preliminary Championships in the current year or previous calendar year. This is backdated to the 1st January 2017.
 - Have qualified for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne at any event in the past calendar year. Dancers, who qualify for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne are an exception to the rule where they may have automatically qualified due to low entry levels at their Regional Oireachtas. These dancers may remain in the Preliminary grade, if they so wish, until such time they win out of the grade.
- 20. Competitors can only dance in either Preliminary or Open Championship; they may not compete in both.
- 21. If a dancer wins a Preliminary Championship where there were 5 or fewer dancers in the competition, the dancer will still be eligible to enter a Preliminary Championship.
- 22. The points above apply when a dancer competes from Under 10 & upwards. A dancer, who has been placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in an Open Championship in the age groups below Under 10, will be eligible to compete in Preliminary Championships. (Teachers are advised / requested to use their own discretion)
- 23.A Panel of Three Adjudicators will judge all Championships from Under 7 upwards
- 24. An Coimisiún has ruled that from 1st January of each year, that no block, en pointe, stationary or moving be allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the under 12 age group Worldwide. The Under 12 Age Group will be allowed to Toe Walk from 1st September.
- 25. The Feis Organiser will provide Non-Slip flooring for every dance surface; however the Feis Organiser cannot accept any liability for injury sustained whilst dancing.
- 26. Any competitor found to be using artificial carriage aids and subsequently refuses to remove same will be subject to disqualification from that particular competition. Medically prescribed apparatus, proof of which may be required, will be exempt from this ruling
- 27. In order to comply with the health and safety measures, all dancers lining up side stage prior to any round of a competition might be required to perform the simple exercise of raising arms to shoulder level unhindered. If unable to do this due to costume stitching or any arm attachments by the time of their rotation will not be permitted to perform.
- 28.Make-up Rules (4.5 in CLRG Rule Book) 4.5.2 Make-up (including false eyelashes) is not permitted for dancers, in either solo or team competitions, up to and including the Under 10 age group (POINT OF CLARIFICATION) For the purposes of this rule the term "Make-up" includes tinted moisturiser and any artificial tanning products. An Coimisiún hopes that teachers and parents will interpret and apply this rule in the spirit in which it is intended
- 29. Dancers must be properly attired throughout the whole competition and must be in full dance costume and appropriate footwear when receiving awards. No changing allowed in competition areas.
- 30.Any form of unauthorized photography which has the capability to capture a dancer's image whilst in motion, using electronic or manual means, e.g. mobile phone, iPad, standard camera, video camcorder, cine recorder, commercial film, with or without flash enhancement, is expressly forbidden in ALL competitions.
- 31. Photographs taken at awards ceremonies are permitted, however these must be for your own use and not used for public display purposes, unless permission has been obtained.
- 32. Any competition can be moved to another hall at the discretion of the Feis Secretary.
- 33.All Championship cups are perpetual and recipients will be responsible for any loss or damage and for the safe return in adequate time to be presented to subsequent winners.
- 34. Competitions may be combined at the feis organiser's discretion if only one competitor is entered.
- 35. Parents are responsible for the conduct of their children, at all times, whilst attending the Feis.
- 36. The Feis Organiser accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage to personal property.
- 37.No Smoking is permitted on school premises. There are designated areas outside the school gates.
- 38. Objections against any breach of the above rules must be made in writing, and signed, to the Feis Secretary and accompanied by a fee of £25.00, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld. If parents have any constructive comments to make about any aspect of Feiseanna, these would be welcomed by the council and should be put in writing. It should be noted that anonymous correspondence cannot be dealt with.

Trophies/Medals will be awarded in accordance with the <u>minimum</u> requirements as laid down by the **Southern England Regional Council**:

- · 2 medal where there is 5 OR less competitors
- · 4 medals where there are 6-10 competitors
- · 7 medals where there are 11-20 competitors
- · 10 medals where there are 21-30 competitors
- · 14 medals where there are 31- 40 competitors
- · 1 medal for each additional 5 or part of 5 competitors.
